

**CITY OF CORONADO**

**TRAFFIC OPERATIONS COMMITTEE  
MINUTES**

**Thursday, June 23, 2005**

The regular meeting of the Traffic Operations Committee (T.O.C.) was held on Thursday, June 23, 2005, at 2:00 p.m. in the Police Facility Emergency Operations Center. Present were Scott Huth, Ed Walton, Tony Peña, Kim Raddatz and Paul Crook. Also present were Dave Johnson, Assistant Engineer and Laszlo Waczek, Patrol Sergeant.

1. Minutes of the May 26, 2005 Meeting – The minutes were unanimously approved as written.

2. Oral Communications – None.

3. Recommendation Regarding a Stop Sign Warrant Analysis at the Intersection of Glorietta Boulevard and San Luis Rey Avenue – Three residents who were unable to attend the meeting requested that their comments be shared with the T.O.C. Their comments are as follows:

A woman who lives on San Luis Rey and did not wish to leave her name said she is neither for nor against a stop sign at this location. She agrees that it makes sense to slow the traffic down, but stopping cars causes more pollution from emissions and she thinks a yield sign would be more effective.

Mrs. Hakes, 1705 San Luis Rey said a stop sign is not needed at this location. She's lived there for 20 years and there's never been a problem here. She wonders why anyone would want a stop sign here.

Cathy Morton, 680 Glorietta supports a stop sign at this location. She thinks it will improve safety.

Mr. Peña moved to approve the staff recommendation to install one stop sign on San Luis Rey Avenue at the intersection of Glorietta Boulevard (north). Mr. Walton seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

4. Recommendation Regarding the Modification of Various Curb Markings around the High School Site – This item was pulled at the request of CUSD Superintendent Marilyn Wheeler. CUSD will notify the City when they are ready to have this addressed.

5. Recommendation Regarding Updating the City's Warrant for Installation of Angle Parking – Mr. Crook said he had read the minutes from the April 21, 2005 T.O.C. meeting at which he was not present. There was an item on that agenda concerning the potential installation of diagonal parking on the 600 block of D Avenue. He would be opposed to doing that. He would like the revised angle parking warrant to state that other circumstances such as schools will be taken into consideration when evaluating angle parking locations. Mr. Johnson said that criteria #2 of the revised warrant states "and no peak hour problems with congestion" and asked if that would cover Mr. Crook's concern.

Mr. Crook replied that “peak hour” covers peak hours, but he wants something that can cover other situations.

Mr. Walton suggested creating a fifth criterion that would state that the City Council must approve changes to angle parking areas via the T.O.C. and that school and hospital zones will be taken into consideration.

Mr. Peña moved to approve the revised angle parking zone warrant with the addition of a fifth criterion, as stated by Mr. Walton. Mr. Crook seconded the motion and it passed unanimously.

Brian Cowan, initiator of item #3, arrived late and was informed of the T.O.C.’s action. He thanked the members for their decision.

The meeting adjourned at 2:08 p.m.
