Minutes

ROLL CALL: Doug Andersen, Rob Crenshaw, Tom Ritter, Susie Vetter, Mary Youngman, Ron Yarbrough and Roger Miller (Chair).

Absent: Fred Gerszewski, Mayor Tanaka, Tony Tessicini and Bill Wilson.

MINUTES: The Minutes of the June 28, 2012 meeting were accepted as presented.

ORAL COMMUNICATIONS:

DIRECTOR'S REPORT: The Committee was updated on the following:

- Information was handed out regarding landscaping around the Golf Course Maintenance Building including pictures, survey summary report and staff recommendations. Mrs. Worley of 636 Glorietta Blvd and Mrs. Casanova of 628 Glorietta Blvd were present to discuss their concerns. Mrs. Casanova supports the staff recommendation and Mrs. Worley would prefer that the Maintenance Building be relocated or that all the landscape be removed. It was pointed out that relocating or rebuilding the Maintenance Building was not under consideration at this time. Mrs. Worley would like the Golf employees not to park in front of her house. The Committee's position is that it is a public street. After much discussion, the Committee approved a landscaping plan that includes tree pruning, a general clean-up and adding shrubs and ground cover. A suggestion was made to add lighting to discourage unauthorized after-hours activities. Additional lighting with motion sensors will be evaluated.
- Recommendation was made to purchase two Cora bike racks approved by the Bicycle Advisory Committee and remove the existing bike rack located by the Driving Range. The Committee approved.
- The golf rounds for FY 2011-2012 showed a slight increase over the FY 2010-2011 numbers.
- Back Nine Play Policy was reviewed and discussed. The Committee agreed that the policy was fair and equitable.
- The request by the CMGC to allow split tees on Men's Day (Wednesday) to promote more participation was discussed. The 10:00 a.m. to 11:00 a.m. tee times were not being utilized because it was too late and groups would not finish until the afternoon. It was suggested that split tees would accommodate more players and the later start times would be better utilized by the Course. The Committee agreed and felt that it should be done on a trial basis.
