Intro to Open Water Lifeguarding

(San Diego Regional Lifeguard Academy)

Catalog Course Description: This 80-hour introductory level course involves lecture and skills training for those aspiring to be lifeguards for ocean and inland beaches. Subject matter ranges from the history of lifeguarding and the responsibilities of the individual lifeguard, to the hands-on skills required to rescue and assist the public. Content of the course will follow the standards of the United States Lifesaving Association. Special note: This course is extremely physically demanding; excellent health and physical fitness is required; strong swimming skills required in order to successfully pass this course.

The San Diego Regional Academy has rigorous physical training. Included in the physical training are events that must be completed under a specified time, including at least two (2) 500-meter swims in ten (10) minutes or less, a one (1) mile run in eight (8) minutes or less and other timed run-swim-run events.

YOU WILL BE RUNNING AND SWIMMING ON THE 1ST DAY – BRING APPROPRIATE SHOES AND SWIM ATTIRE

LFGD 101A – Emergency Medical Care of the Sick and Injured

(American Red Cross Emergency Medical Response – Spring 2023, 1 Unit)

Course Description: This 52-hour introductory course involves lecture and hands on skills training for those individuals who have a duty to respond in emergency situations (first responders). Course involves training in knowledge and skills necessary to sustain life, reduce pain, and minimize the consequences of injury or sudden illness.

Certifications: The following Red Cross Certifications are awarded upon successful completion of the standardized Red Cross written exams and hands on skills tests. Emergency Medical Response certification (valid for two years), Basic Life Support for Health Care Providers CPR/AED (valid for 2 years), Oxygen Administration for the Professional Rescuer (valid for one year) and Preventing Disease Transmission (blood borne pathogens). This course is consistent with the U.S. Department of Transportation (DOT) first responder curriculum and exceeds the requirements of the California Health and Safety Code (Title 22).
