To Coronado Utility Providers -

The City of Coronado is asking for your cooperation in an effort to maintain the surface condition of City streets. The City's Public Services & Engineering Department is in charge of implementing a pavement management program that currently calls for every public street in the City to receive some form of maintenance treatment (typically a slurry seal or pavement overlay) once every seven years. To assist in the City's effort to maintain a high-quality roadway network, we are asking that the following guidelines be followed:

Slurry Seals: For roadways that have received a slurry seal, roadway construction that requires trenching or causes pavement damage should be avoided for a 12-month period following the slurry seal.

Pavement Overlays: For roadways that have received a pavement overlay, roadway construction that requires trenching or causes pavement damage should be avoided for a 24-month period following the pavement overlay. Construction required to respond to emergency situations or provide new customers with service would be exempt from these guidelines.

As an effort to assist your construction planning, the following locations are **scheduled to receive a slurry seal** during the 2023/24 fiscal year:

The following streets **are scheduled to receive a pavement overlay** during the 2023/24 fiscal year:

- Second Street (Alameda Blvd to Orange Ave)
- Third Street (Pomona Ave & Glorietta Blvd)
- Public parking lot (First Street and D Ave)

An exhibit showing **current moratoriums**, as well as the above-mentioned planned construction is attached to this letter. Should a street be disturbed during its moratorium period, repair requirements will be assessed by the Engineering Division on a case-by-case basis.
