## Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ)

All Coronado Fourth of July events have been cancelled including: the Run/Walk, Rough Water Swim, Fun Run, Parade, Art in the Park and the summer Concerts in the Park and the Glorietta Bay Fireworks. The "Big Bay Boom" fireworks display has also been cancelled.

\*San Diego County **prohibits** the possession or use of any fireworks including sparklers.

**Do I have to wear a face mask:** The law requires that all San Diego County residents wear a face covering whenever they are outside and within 6 feet of someone who is not from their household. Children under the age of 2 are not required to wear a mask, and people with developmental disabilities as well as medical or mental health conditions that prevent them from wearing a mask are also exempt

**Can I have a party or BBQ at my home?** The current County Public Health Order prohibits gatherings unless individuals live in the same household.

**What time is the Beach Open?** Coronado Beaches, including Dog Beach are open from 6 am until 8 pm (sunset)

**What time does Silver Strand State Beach open?** Silver Strand State Beach is set to open at approximately 6 am on July 4 and close at 9pm. Vehicles, motorhomes and trailers are not permitted to stop, park or line up along any part of the highway or roadway at any time.

**Are fires or barbecues allowed on the public beach?** It is not permitted to build a fire on any public beach. Portable barbecues are allowed on public beaches, all coal and debris from a portable barbecue must be discarded in an official Hot Coal container.

**Where can I park my car?** Parking is authorized in any marked legal parking spot. The parking meters and permit parking will not be enforced on July 3<sup>rd</sup> and July 4<sup>th</sup>; however, all other parking rules and regulations will be in effect. Saving parking spaces is not allowed.

**Where can I park my motor home/RV/trailer?** Motor homes can be parked in any legal space they fit into. Oversized vehicles are not required to obtain an oversized vehicle permit on July 4<sup>th</sup>. Awnings, slide outs or electrical cables or hoses may not protrude from motor homes or RV's or trailers as they create hazards for other vehicles, bicyclist or pedestrians. All trailers must remain attached to vehicles being towed and there is no overnight camping or lodging allowed in the City.

**What if my car gets towed?** If your vehicle is towed, please contact the Police Department at (619) 522-7350.

**Are anchorage permits needed for Glorietta Bay (A-5)?** Permits will not be required from 12 pm on July 2<sup>nd</sup> until 12 pm on July 6. Coronado Lifeguards will be patrolling the area throughout the weekend. Overnight anchoring permits will be required starting Monday July 6<sup>th</sup>.
